

Accessibility Statement

Accessibility compliance status

This website is **partially compliant** with the requirements set out in Appendix A of the UNI CEI EN 301 549 standard, due to the instances of non-compliance and/or exemptions detailed below.

Inaccessible content

The content listed below is inaccessible for the following reason: it does not comply with Law No. 4 of 9 January 2004.

In preparing this accessibility statement, we have taken into account the WCAG 2.1 standards and feedback from a panel of people with a range of disabilities. The panel tested the website using a variety of assistive technologies and interaction methods, including screen readers (JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver), keyboard navigation and magnification features.

The non-conformities and the corresponding WCAG success criteria are set out below:

1.1.1 Non-text content: Some significant non-text content does not have an appropriate text alternative. As a result, the information provided to users may be incomplete, unclear or redundant.

1.3.1 Information and relationships: In some cases, information, structure and relationships presented visually are not available in text form or cannot be correctly interpreted by assistive technologies.

1.4.1 Use of colour: The visual distinction between plain text and links is not always sufficiently clear.

1.4.10 Reflow: When content is enlarged to 400% or viewed on a smaller screen, some information or functionality may overlap, be clipped or become unavailable.

1.4.3 Contrast (minimum): In some cases, the contrast between the text and the background is insufficient to ensure adequate readability.

2.1.1 Keyboard: Some functionality cannot be fully operated using a keyboard or an equivalent interface, preventing access for users who do not use a pointer device.

2.2.2 Pause, stop, hide: Some content that is moving, flashing, scrolling or updating automatically cannot be paused, stopped, hidden or controlled by the user.

2.4.4 Purpose of the link (in context): The purpose of some links is not clear from the surrounding text or context, making it difficult to determine the destination or action they will trigger.

2.4.6 Headings and labels: Some headings or labels do not describe the subject, purpose or function of the associated content or controls clearly enough.

2.4.7 Visible focus: When navigating using the keyboard, the focus indicator is not always visible or sufficiently recognisable, making it difficult to identify the active element.

4.1.2 Name, role, value: For some user interface components, the name, role, state or value is not correctly communicated to assistive technologies, or changes to these are not programmatically communicated.

4.1.3 Status messages: Some status messages are not recognised programmatically and are therefore not communicated to assistive technologies unless the user moves focus to them.
